2	Northern Ireland's Draft Climate Action Plan 2023 – 2027
	<p>DD introduced Claire Cockerill (CC), Director of Climate Action Delivery at DAERA who provided a presentation on Northern Ireland's Draft Climate Action Plan, which is currently out for consultation.</p> <p>Presentation – download here.</p> <p>A group Q&A followed – see recording.</p> <p>DD thanked CC for her excellent presentation and thanked the group for their questions.</p> <p>Action: DAERA to respond to Robert Walsh on blue green carbon query.</p>
3	Fossil Fuel Non-Proliferation Treaty
	<p>Peter Heaney, Head of Region at Trócaire, provided a short briefing on the need for a Fossil Fuel Non-Proliferation Treaty and how both Government and Local Government can support it. He noted that Newry Mourne and Down District Council had recently passed a motion in support of an International Treaty and Belfast City Council are reviewing a similar motion currently.</p> <p>Peter shared his email address with the group, asking Members to contact him if they are interested in supporting the motion. See template Endorsement Motion.</p>
4	Installation of individual gas boilers at sheltered housing
	<p>DD brought to the group's attention a letter sent by a member of the public raising concerns about the Department for Communities' support for the installation of individual gas boilers with prepayment meters in social housing at Fitzroy Court in Belfast. The individual highlights concerns associated with the disruption caused by the installation and the increase in greenhouse gas emissions from individual boilers compared with communal heating systems, asking the Department to disavow this approach.</p> <p>Members were invited to note the issues raised in the letter circulated and consider if and how the APG may wish to respond. As there were no other elected members the decision was postponed to the next meeting.</p> <p>Andy Frew (AF) noted that communal heating schemes powered by heat pumps are compatible with individual metering and pay-as-you-go options. DD thanked AF for his input.</p>
